What is Second Chance?

In 2018, UN Women initiated the development of the Second Chance Education and Vocational Learning (SCE) programme that would provide marginalized women who have lost out on an education with pathways to employment through a tailored learn-to-earn approach. The ongoing programme is aimed at empowerment of the most marginalized women who, owing to poverty and gender-based discrimination, have been denied access to opportunities at an early age.

The programme undertakes a holistic approach to empowerment using the pathways of learning, employment and entrepreneurship. The SCE programme enables and offers women opportunities to (1) re-enter into formal education, (2) undertake vocational education and (3) receive entrepreneurship training and skills and 4) potential employment. SCE offers a comprehensive solution by adopting a holistic approach, leveraging partnerships at all levels, using innovative pedagogies and finance to achieve its objective. SCE is being implemented in 12 districts across 4 states of India – Bihar, Maharashtra, Odisha and Rajasthan, covering 200 villages.

SCE Global Conference 1 - Sharing, Networking and Building the Evidence Base

This platform was created for IPs to showcase their work for two days, and to actively engage in opportunities for discussion (through live dialogue, live typed chat and asynchronous discussion forums). SCE Covid19 relief efforts







Listed below are some of the relief measures undertaken by UN Women's Second Chance Education (SCE) Programme in India, in the wake of the second wave. These response mechanisms and measures are a part of the SCE programme's initiative to mitigate communities against the C19 second wave.

- 4000 medicine kits distribution to persons who were Covid positive or with Covid-like symptoms.
- Distribution of 3050 dry ration kit packets for COVID infected patients.
- 931 oximeters distribution to ASHA/ANM workers.
- 60 thermometers distribution to ASHA/ANM workers.
- 455 face shields distribution to ASHA/ANM workers

This section on Covid19 relief efforts is a continuation from the previous page. -

- Block wise awareness drives on vehicles with sound system (or public address system) key messages: vaccination, identification and management of symptoms.
- 821 masks distribution to ASHA/ANM and cadres.
- 300 gloves distribution to ASHA/ANM and cadres.
- 16 community cadres were supported through insurance.

Women have participated in employment training and briefing sessions, in Gaya (Bihar), as part of UN Women's Second Chance Education and Vocational Learning (SCE) Programme. These training sessions have been facilitated by partner organizations PRADAN (Professional Assistance for Development Action) and B-ABLE (BASIX Academy for Building Lifelong Employability Ltd).

New Innings: skills based placement





Neetu's Story...







Neetu Kumari, hails from Pilkhi village of Muraul block in the district of Muzaffarpur (Bihar, India). Neetu was 30, at the time when her story was documented. She fondly reminisced her days at school, while narrating her story.

Neetu was married at a very early age i.e., even before she could complete high school or senior secondary education. There came a time when she eventually had to drop out. She has two children and household chores took up most of her time.

Her husband was a hired hand and earned somewhere between INR 300 to INR 350 a day. This was barely enough to meet the daily needs of the family and there was no end to their economic hardships. There were instances, when the family had to cut back on food supplies.

The implementation cycle for the Second Chance Education and Vocational Learning (SCE) Programme in Muzaffarpur district, began in 2019. During their initial assessment and other field activities, AKRSP (Aga Khan Rural Support Programme - India), identified Neetu Kumari as a potential beneficiary.

AKRSP is an Implementing Partner for UN Women's SCE programme in India. Aga Khan Rural Support Programme (India) provides direct support for the betterment of rural communities, promoting sustainable natural resource use and human resource development.

Neetu was an avid learner and got herself enrolled as a trainee, under the SCE programme. The skill development training component was particularly useful in her context. She was enrolled in one of the tailoring training cohorts.

After completing the training module, with support from SCE programme and AKRSP, she started her own enterprise. She started stitching clothes in order to generate income. During the pandemic, Neetu was also stitching masks and selling them in the local market. At this point, she was able to earn a monthly income of approximately INR 2500 to INR 2700 per month.

Neetu Kumari's story serves as an example of true grit and determination in the face of immense hardships. Her story also looks at the timely intervention that led her to tap into a specialized skill set in order to set up a small-scale enterprise.

Neetu has since continued with her endeavour to reach newer and greater heights. She is our #AgentofChange.

SCE Featured Film







In 2015, women's illiteracy remained stubbornly high at 477 million across the globe, falling just 1 per cent since 2000. By 2019, this number had reached 484,991,881 illiterate women in the world*.

UN Women in partnership with BHP Foundation is seeking to break this trend by creating a global second chance model for women to fill the gaps in their education and link them to earning and leadership opportunities. The Second Chance Education and Vocational Learning programme gives hope to some of the world's most disadvantaged women – who have missed out on education and are at risk of being left behind. The programme is being piloted in Cameroon, Jordan, India, Mexico, Chile and Australia, directly benefitting 67,000 young women from indigenous, refugee, displaced and low-income groups. Through local organisations, the Second Chance programme gives women support that is tailored to their needs as learners and earners.


