# What is Second Chance?

In 2018, UN Women initiated the development of the Second Chance Education and Vocational Learning (SCE) programme that would provide marginalized women who have lost out on an education with pathways to employment through a tailored learn-to-earn approach. The ongoing programme is aimed at empowerment of the most marginalized women who, owing to poverty and gender-based discrimination, have been denied access to opportunities at an early age.

The programme undertakes a holistic approach to empowerment using the pathways of learning, employment and entrepreneurship. The SCE programme enables and offers women opportunities to (1) reenter into formal education, (2) undertake vocational education and (3) receive entrepreneurship training and skills and (4) potential employment. SCE offers a comprehensive solution by adopting a holistic approach, leveraging partnerships at all levels, using innovative pedagogies and finance to achieve its objective. SCE is being implemented in 12 districts across 4 states of India – Bihar, Maharashtra, Odisha and Rajasthan, covering 200 villages.

#### **Skilling and Employment**

A block level camp for skilling and employment was organized at Kamakhyanagar, in the Dhenkanal district of Odisha. SCE programme candidates undergoing skill training attended the camp, presided over by Additional Block Development Officer, Zilla Parishad, Chairman and District Employment Officer.

#### **Orientation Session**

20 SCE programme candidates attended a preplacement orientation session, at Sahana Clothing Pvt. Ltd. in Tiruppur, Tamil Nadu.

64 SCE programme candidates from Kishanganj (Bihar) have relocated to Katihar, to begin their GDA (General Duty Assistant) training. The General Duty Assistant/GDA training is designed to provide quality care to patients admitted in nursing homes and hospitals.



# In conversation with Tapaswini Barik...

Tapaswini Barik, 22, from Odisha, is undergoing training and skilling, (at the Vigyan Bharati Charitable Trust Skill Development Cell), through the SCE programme in India. She aspires to one day work in a hospital, as a full-time nurse.

When did you begin your GDA training with the SCE programme in India? A: I enrolled for the skilling programme/course in March 2021.

What kind of skills are you learning here? A: I am currently learning - emergency medical technician skills, nursing, computer skills, and English.

How were things prior to joining the skills centre? Were you employed? A: Most of the time, I was helping my mother with household chores and responsibilities. What do you hope to achieve after completing the course? A: I would very much like to work in a hospital.

Why is it important for you to learn these skills and get work?

A: So that I am able to financially support my family.

How has Covid-19 impacted you in the last year and a half?

A: It has pushed me to try harder. I am more determined to achieve my goals and work in the healthcare sector, alongside supporting my family.

Does India need more women in the healthcare workforce? Why?

A: Yes, women have specific skill set more suited to medical emergency settings (like nurses, nurse assistants, ward in-charge, etc,). The pandemic has further increased this need.

What are you aspiring for, at the moment? A: I would like to complete the GNM (General Nursing and Midwifery) course, so that I can work as a nurse in a hospital.
