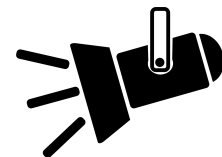

WHAT IS SECOND CHANCE?

In 2018, UN Women initiated the development of the Second Chance Education and Vocational Learning (SCE) programme that would provide marginalized women who have lost out on an education with pathways to employment through a tailored learn-to-earn approach. The ongoing programme is aimed at empowerment of the most marginalized women who, owing to poverty and gender-based discrimination, have been denied access to opportunities at an early age.

The programme undertakes a holistic approach to empowerment using the pathways of learning, employment and entrepreneurship. The SCE programme enables and offers women opportunities to (1) re-enter into formal education, (2) undertake vocational education and (3) receive entrepreneurship training and skills and (4) potential employment. SCE offers a comprehensive solution by adopting a holistic approach, leveraging partnerships at all levels, using innovative pedagogies and finance to achieve its objective. SCE is being implemented in 12 districts across 4 states of India – Bihar, Maharashtra, Odisha and Rajasthan, covering 200 villages.



Inauguration of spice centre in Baran, Rajasthan



On 22nd December 2021, UN Women's Second Chance Education (SCE) programme team visited Kishanganj in Baran, Rajasthan.

UN Women's SCE India team visited the Women Empowerment Hub at Kishanganj (Baran, Rajasthan) where the Spice Centre supported by PNB Housing Finance Limited was inaugurated by Ms. Kanta Singh, Country Programme Manager, SCE programme India. The team also interacted with staff involved in the processing and packing of ginger and garlic products. Various other products like pickle, pulses and spices are also packaged and sold with the brand name - 'Katori'.

The Country Programme Manager also interacted with young girls and women, who used computers at the hub. They discussed ways in which the hub enabled them to enhance their digital skills and find jobs. The SCE team interacted with colleagues from Manjari Foundation (on-ground implementing partner), cadres, master trainers and learners within the education vertical.



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WOMEN'S ENTREPRENEURSHIP

The Women's Entrepreneurship Cell under the Skill Development, Employment and Entrepreneurship Department (SDEED), Government of Maharashtra focuses on increasing inter-departmental coordination and support for women's entrepreneurship, increasing women's representation in start-up and business ecosystems and building national and international linkages for women's enterprises and providing necessary mentoring and training support. A letter (dated 1st February 2021) addressed to Ms. Kanta Singh, Country Programme Manager, Second Chance Education (SCE), UN Women India, from Dr. Suvarna Kharat, Joint Secretary, SDEED, Government of Maharashtra acknowledges the UN Women SCE team's support in setting up the Women Entrepreneurship Cell under SDEED, Government of Maharashtra.



SOLAR HATCHERY UNITS AND WOMEN AUTO-RICKSHAW DRIVERS

Women are learning how to drive autorickshaws as part of the Second Chance Education and Vocational Learning (SCE) Programme in Gaya (Bihar, India). This initiative has begun, with support from SCE India partner organizations PRADAN (Professional Assistance for Development Action) and PRAN (Preservation and Proliferation of Rural Resources and Nature).

In Rayagada district of Odisha (India), solar hatchery units have been set up, as a group enterprise activity.

SKILLING AND PLACEMENT

This skilling programme for women was organized by B-ABLE India (BASIX-Academy for Building Lifelong Employability Limited) in collaboration with PRADAN (Professional Assistance for Development Action). The programme involved acquiring specialized skill-sets in - fabric assembly, design and tailoring. Upon successful completion, the women have been placed with various organizations such as Sahana Clothing Pvt. Ltd, Tiruppur (Tamil Nadu).



GROUP ENTERPRISE ACTIVITY

An off-farm produce group was formed in Rayagada (Odisha) in order to manage production, supply and distribution of Tamarind. This FPO (Farmer Producer Company) was also set up to build a linkage with the market, alongside establishing a sustainable business. In order to generate working capital, they have been working with Mission Shakti and ORMAS (Odisha Rural Development and Marketing Society). They are also in the process of procuring machinery and setting up a fully functional warehouse for better management.

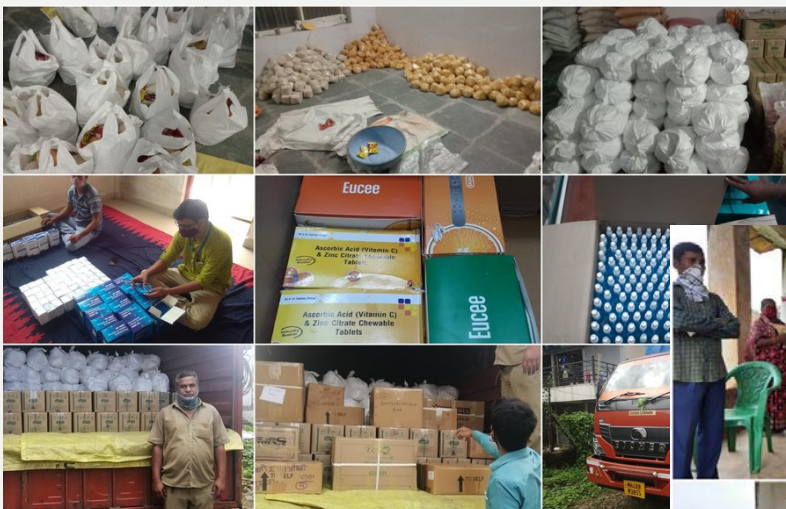
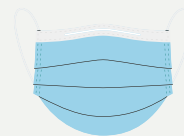

SCE COVID19 RELIEF EFFORTS



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SCE COVID 19 RELIEF EFFORTS

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Listed below are some of the relief measures undertaken by UN Women's Second Chance Education (SCE) Programme in India, in the wake of the second wave. These response mechanisms and measures are a part of the SCE programme's initiative to mitigate communities against the C19 second wave.



- 4000 medicine kits - distribution to persons who were Covid positive or with Covid-like symptoms.
- Distribution of 3050 dry ration kit packets for COVID infected patients.
- 931 oximeters - distribution to ASHA*/ANM* workers.
- 60 thermometers - distribution to ASHA/ANM workers.
- 455 face shields - distribution to ASHA/ANM workers
- Block wise awareness drives on vehicles with sound system (or public address system) - key messages: vaccination, identification and management of symptoms.
- 821 masks - distribution to ASHA/ANM and cadres.
- 300 gloves - distribution to ASHA/ANM and cadres.
- 16 community cadres were supported through insurance.

**An accredited social health activist (ASHA) is a community health worker instituted by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) as a part of India's National Rural Health Mission (NRHM). *Auxiliary nurse midwife or Auxiliary nurse hybrids commonly known as ANM, is a village-level female health worker in India who is known as the first contact person between the community and the health services.*

THE ALL WOMEN BEE-KEEPER ENTERPRISE

A group of women started harvesting honey and ensured a steady source of income generation by selling the product in the local market. This group-enterprise has been established, operated and managed by an all women group, under UN Women's Second Chance Education and Vocational Learning (SCE) Programme in India. As part of the programme, they received financial and technical support as well as skills training from partner organizations PRADAN (Professional Assistance for Development Action) and AKRSP (Aga Khan Rural Support Programme India). PRADAN is the lead implementing partner and AKRSP is a consortium partner for UN Women's SCE programme in India. As part of the training, the women were taken for exposure visits. They even received expert advice from scientists belonging to Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK). RURAL SELF-EMPLOYMENT



This initiative is part of the collaboration between the Second Chance Education and Vocational Learning (SCE) Programme and the SBI-RSETI initiative (State Bank of India - Rural Self Employment Training Institutes). Through this collaboration, SCE programme India candidates will benefit from Skill India certification, SBI certification and loan facility.

FIELD VISIT TO ODISHA

In Odisha, the SCE programme is being implemented at 3 districts in 4 blocks namely Dhenkanal (Kamakhyanager and Kankadahad), Rayagada (Kolnara) and Mayurbhanj (Thakurmunda). The programme is being implemented by PRADAN (Professional Assistance for Development Action) as the lead with consortium partners Aaina, Development Alternative, B-Able and Shristi in Odisha. During her first official visit to Odisha (21st to 23rd September, 2021), UN Women India Country Representative Susan Ferguson met with government officials and women on the ground, and stressed on the importance of education and skilling of women and girls for building back better.

FIELD VISIT TO RAJASTHAN

The UN Women India team along with colleagues from lead partner PRADAN (Professional Assistance for Development Action) visited Chittorgarh in Rajasthan (India) from 4th to 6th October, 2021. The field visit involved - interactions with the implementing partner organization team on the ground - Manjari Foundation, interactions with women and girls at the women empowerment hub in Chittorgarh, a visit to the spice enterprise/processing unit in Munga Ka Kheda village, interaction with women farmers, discussions with community and field cadres at the women empowerment hub, interaction with skilled candidates and individual businesses/entrepreneurs, visits to agricultural land and farmers' plots, among others.



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SCE PROGRAMME CANDIDATE - HIRA CHATIYA



Hira Chatiya, 32, is a farm educator with the SCE programme in India. She is from Munga Ka Kheda village, in Chittorgarh, Rajasthan. She has been associated with the Manjari Foundation (an implementing partner for SCE), in the agriculture sector, alongside undertaking NREGA work (Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act). She has helped and worked with 65-70 local women, in her village. She has also assisted women with organic farming initiatives. 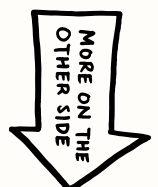
#WORLDTEACHERSDAY
